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








WACHS NDIS Interface



WACHS Services Interfacing with NDIS

NDIS Supports Delivered by WACHS

- Therapeutic service to people with disability
- CAEP (Assistive Technology and Home Mods)
- Home and Community Care
- Respite

*Identified as state and commonwealth inkind/cash contributions within the State and Commonwealth bilateral agreement

Bilateral Agreement – Transition to NDIS

- '..work towards minimising in-kind contributions to the NDIS by the end of 2019-20 to the greatest extent possible, and where possible cash out in-kind programs to accelerate the transition from in-kind services to cash contributions..'.
- Transition, including cashing out of in-kind services, to be completed by 1st July 2020
- Maintain continuity of supports

Key Messaging

- NDIS and WACHS will work together to support the roll-out of NDIS in WA, including
 - supporting people with disability who may interface with the health system
 - transitioning in-kind services
- WACHS will provide continuity of support for clients during the transition period
- WACHS will not seek to be a provider of NDIS services.

NDIS Roll Out in WACHS

Trial Roll Out	
1 st July 2014	Roll out Lower South West (WANDIS)
1 st January 2017	Roll out inner Wheatbelt (National NDIS/WA NDIS)
1 st July 2017	Roll out Pilbara and Kimberley (National NDIS)

National NDIS Roll Out	
April 2018	Roll in – Inner Wheatbelt roll in from WA NDIS to National NDIS
1 st July 2018	Roll out - Wheatbelt (remaining)
1 st September 2018	Roll in – Lower South West
1 st October 2018	Roll out - Goldfields, Upper South West
October – Dec 2018	Roll in – Kimberley and Pilbara
1 st July 2019	Midwest, Great Southern
