






Mid 2020 – Chief Health Officer authorized state wide public health response to infectious syphilis

\*The concern being – increasing rates of Congenital Syphilis








### April 2021:

Department of Health (WA) and Flinders University offered health services access to Syphilis Point of Care Tests – with the Abbott test strips.

- 1. Establish a policy and protocol at DYHS
- 2. Education staff regarding syphilis and the POCT program
- 3. Establish a registry
- 4. Streamline and modify Clinical Items





DYHS all patients are screened by AHP/RN prior to seeing GP

 screening consists of checking pts vitals signs (BP, PR, BSL etc), reason for presentation and aims to include other facets such as testing HbA1c/ACR

The Syphilis POCT was incorporated into screening

AHP/RN given general guidelines on POCT

 females of reproductive age, homeless, MSM, pregnant, those seeking STI, anyone who has had sex (and any patient that is accepting of testing)

Positive/negative results entered into clinical item – and passed to GP



## **Education**

75 clinical staff (AHP/RN/GP) have been educated on Syphilis POCT

Weekly reminders about syphilis and POCT – sent to all clinical staff weekly (via email and discussed regularly at morning communication huddles)

- \*to complete testing
- \*update on syphilis outbreak
- \*clinical information about syphilis



# **Development of Syphilis Registry at DYHS**



2021 – started with 90 known/documented cases of syphilis

Review of all clinical items, previous serology results = resulted in increasing numbers of documented cases

As of March 2023 = 409 known cases on DYHS registry

- 1969-2017 = 179 cases (37 untreated/unclear treatment)
- 2017 to current = 209 cases (17 incomplete)
- 37 unknown/undefined cases

\*of known cases – 14% remain untreated/undertreated – all have received at least 1x LAB

- \*nil infectious cases at DYHS
- \*\*Registry is maintained by 2x sexual health nurses and 1x GP


### Clinical Items developed:

Prior to 2021 – DYHS has multiple clinical items attributed to syphilis



# **Syphilis Clinical Items**

- Syphilis; Treated; male
- Syphilis; Untreated; male
- Syphilis; Treated; female
- Syphilis; Untreated; female
- Congenital Syphilis
- LA bicillin (syphilis)
- \*for reporting and recall purposes
- \*provides clear pathways for diagnosis and management



## **Results of POCT DYHS**

15th April 2021 to 28 February 2023

Complete 863 POCT

Serology: 4900

### 24 cases of previous untreated syphilis

<2 yrs: 15 cases (included 7 pregnant cases)

>2 yrs: 8 cases

Unspecified: 1 case (pt consented to testing, but declined formal bloods)

= 2.8% diagnosis rate

\*all cases have been rendered non-infectious

28 cases of previous treated elsewhere (not documented/disclosed/forgotten)
