Background

- MCDC is Perth's Public Health Unit
- Growing number of syphilis cases among the people experiencing homelessness community
- Contact tracing alone is ineffective
- Need for mass screening realised
- Consultations with health service providers and venues frequented by people experiencing homelessness



Aims

- 1. Increase testing for syphilis amongst people experiencing homelessness in the Perth metropolitan area.
- 2. Prevent transmission of syphilis from positive cases.
- 3. Increase testing for HIV amongst people experiencing homelessness in the Perth metropolitan area.
- 4. Provision of opportunistic influenza and COVID-19 vaccinations.



Program overview

- Syphilis PoCT serology, treatment, contact tracing and pregnancy testing for WCBA
- HIV PoCT and referral to RPH Immunology
- Influenza and COVID-19 vaccinations
- \$20 restricted Woolworths voucher for engagement with any service
- Health promotion resources distributed condoms, STI pamphlets, harm reduction contacts




Results - HIV

- Inclusion of HIV testing and immunisations
- Organisational partnerships

Challenges

- Privacy
- Program duration lack of time to build trust and rapport
- Cultural sensitivity



Community insights

"...vaccination on the lady and now their having a huge conversation in the room all about "I knew someone who had syphilis" and they're all talking about "I didn't realise there's an outbreak" and there was this great big conversation going on about it"

"... *I had at least three people, I think that said* "I'm actually worried that I do have it [HIV]"

"We did have a man who came in and sat... he goes out on the street and he's talking to people out on the street and he said to me "I knew you guys were here because all I've heard is syphilis, HIV, don't share needles, make sure you got your condoms... Everyone was having a really big conversation because of us being there"
