



# Rural Community Residency Program

## 2019 Application Package

Coordinated by the WA Country Health Service, the rural Community Residency Program (CRP) is an exciting and highly regarded program available to Resident Medical Officers (RMOs).

Successful rural CRP RMOs are provided the opportunity to participate in short term, well supervised training placements in a variety of rural settings across WA. During this placement RMOs will spend a minimum of 20% of their time in a community setting.

### Where do I go\*?

WACHS employed RMOs at Broome Hospital can complete a CRP rotation in Broome during their year.

Fiona Stanley Hospital, Royal Perth Hospital or Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital employed RMOs will be seconded to the CRP and can complete placements in a variety of locations such as Albany, Derby, Esperance, Kalgoorlie, Karratha, Kununurra and Narrogin.



#### At the time of placement you need to:

- 1) Hold general registration with the Medical Board of Australia.
- 2) Have a new or existing clinical position at a participating WA Health hospital in 2019.
- 3) Be a Resident Medical Officer.
- 4) Be an Australian citizen or permanent resident.

- ✓ Your statement of interest and curriculum vitae will be used to assess your CRP application.
- ✓ Applications for the CRP are via the centralised RMO application process through the MedJobsWA website. <https://medjobswa.mercury.com.au/>.
- ✓ The CRP is a competitive program. Your application will be assessed by a panel after the closing of the RMO recruitment pool.
