


Destination: Sustainability



- Senators determined the 20 most useful indicators for quality and safety
- 107 indicators provided
- The WA health system one of the first to provide clinicians with this opportunity

If you were responsible for the quality and safety of a major health service... which 20 indicators would you want to see?

Indicators cover the six domains of quality:



Top 10 indicators

Ranking: 1

SAC 1 (Severity Access Code) events

- Reports completed within 28 days
- Timeliness of evaluation reports
- Related to failure to escalate care
- Related to failure of clinical handover

Hospital acquired complications dataset (HACs)

Potentially preventable hospitalisations
