Western Australian Coding Rule

0318/63 CPR – Procedures not normally coded

In ICD-10-AM/ACHI/ACS Tenth Edition, ACS 0042 *Procedures normally not coded* was updated to included cardiopulmonary resuscitation (mechanical and non-mechanical). WA Coding Rule 0812/01 *CPR* – *Procedures not normally coded* is therefore retired.

DECISION

WA Coding Rule 0812/01 CPR – Procedures not normally coded is retired.

Q.

Following previous advice, is it still correct to code cardiopulmonary resuscitation when performed after an episode of cardiac arrest?

Α.

Previous advice given by the WA Coding Committee on 18/01/12 has been superseded by advice given in the NCCC's June 2012 Q&A. This states.

"The NCCC advises that procedure codes for nonmechanical or cardiopulmonary resuscitation performed after cardiac arrest should not be assigned as per principle in ACS 0016 General procedure guidelines which states: "Many procedures may meet the above AIHW definition of a clinical intervention but if they are routine in the treatment of the diagnosis being coded, it may not be necessary to code them."

The NCCC will consider adding 92042-00 [1889] *Nonmechanical methods of resuscitation* and 92052-00 [1890] *Cardiopulmonary resuscitation* to ACS 0042 *Procedures normally not coded* for a future edition of the ACS."

DECISION

Procedure codes for nonmechanical or cardiopulmonary resuscitation performed after cardiac arrest should not be assigned.
