### 0319/04 Follow up for Helicobacter pylori after eradication therapy

WA Coding Rule 0818/01 Follow-up gastroscopy to check for H. pylori after completion of eradication therapy is superseded by ACCD Coding Rule Follow up for H. pylori after eradication therapy (Ref No: Q3375) effective 1 April 2019; (log in to view on the ACCD CLIP portal).

Note: Amendments made to Q3375 Follow up for H. pylori after eradication therapy in ICD-10-AM/ACHI/ACS 12<sup>th</sup> Edition, effective 1 July 2022.

### **DECISION**

WA Coding Rule 0818/01 Follow-up gastroscopy to check for H. pylori after completion of eradication therapy is retired.

# 0818/01 Follow-up gastroscopy to check for *H. pylori* after completion of eradication therapy

Q.

Patient admitted for same-day follow-up gastroscopy to check for presence of *H. pylori* after previously completing *H. pylori* eradication treatment. At scope *H. pylori* is detected without the presence of an associated condition. No other findings are reported.

What is the correct diagnosis code assignment?

#### A.

Follow ACS 0052 Same-day endoscopy – Surveillance and assign 'the condition under surveillance (follow-up/screening) if detected' as principal diagnosis.

H. pylori is the condition detected under surveillance, so is to be assigned as principal diagnosis.

As per ACS 1122 Helicobacter pylori, B96.81 Helicobacter pylori [H. pylori] as the cause of diseases classified to other chapters cannot be assigned where there is no documented association between the H. pylori infection and another condition.

Instead, assign Z22.3 Carrier of other specified bacterial diseases as principal diagnosis following Index pathway:

#### Carrier (suspected) of

- bacterial disease NEC

#### **DECISION**

When *H. pylori* is detected without presence of an associated condition in a same-day follow-up gastroscopy to check for presence of *H. pylori*, assign Z22.3 *Carrier of other specified bacterial diseases* as principal diagnosis.

A query will be submitted to ACCD requesting national classification instruction for these cases.
