### Q.

Various queries have been received regarding morphology coding.

#### Α.

Coding Education Team advice:

As per ACS 0233: If a morphological diagnosis contains two histological terms which have different M codes, select the highest number as it is usually more specific.

Coders should use only information from the conclusion of a histology report when assigning morphology as coders should not be expected to interpret microscopic findings.

Ensure you are satisfied that the pathologist's conclusions are clear if there are differential diagnoses presented in the histopathology report, and the pathologist chooses one as a favoured diagnosis, it is better to query with the clinician for a final diagnosis.

Try to code to the most specific term.

#### **DECISION**

Coders should use only information from the conclusion of a histology report when assigning morphology as coders should not be expected to interpret microscopic findings.
