What is the purpose of the Asthma Action Plan?	The Asthma Action Plan provides information and advice on your treatment and what to do when your condition worsens and you need to take action.	
	The Asthma Action Plan also provides health professionals with information about your treatment.	
	Please take the Asthma Action Plan with you whenever you visit your GP, pharmacist or other health professionals including in hospital.	
Which health professional's name is written on the Asthma Action Plan?	The Asthma Action Plan includes the name of your GP.	
What if my treatment/medication changes	If there is a change in your treatment you should request an update from your GP.	
	If your reliever medication record is full or any of your details change then you should request a new Asthma Action Plan from your pharmacist. The details from the previous card should be transferred to the new Asthma Action Plan.	
How do I get a replacement Asthma Action Plan if I need one?	You should contact your usual GP or pharmacist.
