The impact of stigma and discrimination on mental health support for sex workers

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Background

- Sex workers face higher rates of stigma/discrimination (Benoit, McCarthy & Jansson, 2015)
- Stigma/discrimination can be linked to;
 - Poorer psychological well-being
 - Poorer self-esteem
 - Depression
 - Stress
 - Suicidality

Experiences of stigma/discrimination by mental health professionals

- 77.5% reported having experienced negative treatment, stigma or discrimination
- More than 35% said this occurred often or always
- **22.5%** report **never** experiencing such treatment.







Experiences of stigma/discrimination in mental health settings

- 83% had experienced negative treatment, stigma or discrimination
- More than 40% said this occurred often or always
- **29.8%** report **never** experiencing such treatment.







Advice for Mental Health Professionals

- Don't assume
- Listen
- Don't focus on sex work
- Don't suggest that sex work is the cause of mental health difficulties







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
