

Terms of Reference Healthcare Infection Council of Western Australia (HICWA) Executive Committee

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of the committee is to ensure clinical governance and quality improvement for the prevention and control of infection in Western Australian (WA) healthcare facilities by review and endorsement of appropriate policy recommendations relevant to improved patient outcomes and the monitoring, prevention and control of healthcare associated infections.

2. ACCOUNTABILITY

Recommendations made by the HICWA Executive Committee will be reported through the Assistant Director General (ADG), Public and Aboriginal Health Division PAHD).

3. ROLES and RESPONSIBILITIES

- 3.1. Review the effectiveness and promote standardisation of infection prevention and control programs and policies across the WA health system.
- 3.2 Consider policy recommendations made by the Infection Prevention Policy and Surveillance Unit (IPPSU), the Western Australian Multi-resistant Organism (WAMRO) Expert Advisory Group and Infection Prevention and Control Advisory Group (IPCAG) that incorporates review of financial and human resource requirements, clinical risk and governance, alignment with WA health services and medico-legal considerations.
- 3.3 To refer policy and recommendations to the ADG, PAHD for discussion and / or endorsement by the Director General of Health. This includes relevant mandatory policies or other advisory documents.
- 3.4 Review relevant surveillance reports compiled by the IPPSU prior to submission to the Director General of Health via the ADG.
- 3.5 Receive and review relevant reports and recommendations from the Infection Prevention and Control Advisory Group, ICNET Surveillance System Working Group (ICNET SSWG), the Western Australian Multi-resistant Organism (WAMRO) Expert Advisory Group and other expert groups / organisations as required e.g. Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Healthcare, Ozfoodnet.
- 3.6 Review and consider recommendations from the ICNET SSWG and Health Service Support on enhancements or modifications to the ICNET surveillance system
- 3.7 Nominate representatives to relevant national committees on behalf of WA Health Department as requested.
- 3.8 The health service providers (HSPs) representatives e.g. Executive Director Safety, Quality & Performance or equivalent are responsible for ensuring dissemination of HICWA information within their health service, ensuring appropriate feedback to Hospital Executive Directors and stakeholders occurs.
- 3.9 The IPPSU is responsible for ensuring consultation with local expert advisory groups is obtained when developing statewide mandatory policy or guidelines.

4. MEETING FREQUENCY

The HICWA Executive Committee shall meet quarterly.

5. NOTICE of MEETINGS

- 5.1 Meeting dates for the forthcoming year will be circulated in December of each year.
- 5.2 HICWA members will be forwarded an agenda and associated papers at least five working days prior to the meeting, via email.

6. CHAIRPERSON

The Chairperson shall be the Director, Communicable Disease Control Directorate.

7. QUORUM

A quorum will consist of the Chairperson (or Deputy Chair) and at least eight permanent members (or nominated proxy).

9. PROXY ATTENDEES

Members are to nominate a proxy to the secretariat if they are unable to attend a meeting. Proxy attendees have full decision making rights.

10. SECRETRIAT

Secretarial support will be provided by the IPPSU who are responsible for collation and circulation of papers relevant to the Committee.

11. RECORD of PROCEEDINGS

- 11.1 The Secretariat will keep records of all meetings, agendas and correspondence.
- 11.2 The Secretariat will be responsible for the compilation of agenda items, document distribution and minute taking.

- 11.3 The meeting minutes will be distributed to all members of the Committee. Dissemination of minutes to appropriate personnel at a hospital level is at the discretion of Committee members.
- 11.4 The minutes are confirmed by the Chairperson's signature at each Committee meeting.

12. CONFLICT of INTEREST

- 12.1 Each HICWA member must declare any duality of interest in matters of concern to the HICWA including:
- verbally declare any potential conflicts of interest (COI) at the commencement of each meeting on matters described on the Agenda
- alert the Chairman of any potential COI that may arise during the course of a meeting. 12.2 Where a perceived, potential or actual COI has been declared, the Chairman shall determine how to proceed and advise the meeting accordingly.

13. REVIEW

- 13.1 The terms of reference of the HICWA Executive Committee shall be reviewed annually
- 13.2 An evaluation of the effectiveness of HICWA will be undertaken bi-annually.
