



Global Situation



Cumulative confirmed COVID-19 cases per million people











Response activations:

- 23 January 2020 Public Health Emergency Operations Centre stood up
- 11 March 2020 WHO declare COVID-19 a worldwide pandemic
- 15 March 2020 State of Emergency declared
- 16 March 2020 State Health Incident Coordination Centre stood up
- 23 March 2020 Public Health State of Emergency declared

A dedicated Public Health Emergency Operations Centre (PHEOC)

and State Health Incident Coordination
Centre (SHICC) were activated to address
the strategic management of the pandemic.





SHICC

- concentrate on logistics, planning, liaison, intelligence, non-health operations and public information to prepare and respond to COVID-19 in WA.
- coordinate duties such as rapid planning for quarantine in hospitals, enlisting hotels for quarantine and providing leadership and guidance.

PHEOC

- focus on prevention via community information, resources, fact sheets, guidelines about travel, quarantine requirements and provide an information hotline.
- coordinate the WA health system's contact tracing functions to document people who may have been in contact with COVID-19 cases and may also be at risk.

Potential administering sites	Given at a hospital hub or where special fridges can store the vaccine	Given at a GP's office
Manufacturing	Only currently made in the USA and Europe	Can be made in Australia



- Six Pfizer "hubs" proposed by WA Health:
 - Perth Children's Hospital
 - Port Hedland
 - Geraldton
 - Albany
 - Kalgoorlie
 - Broome
- Program has commenced
- Ability to move vaccine beyond 'hub', noting long travel distances



Who gets vaccinated first?

Under **Phase 1a** of the vaccination program:

- Quarantine hotel workers WA Government vaccination program;
- Frontline health care workers WA Government;
- Aged care and disability staff Australian Government;
- Aged care and disability care residents Australian Government.
- It is expected that everyone in Western Australia will have the opportunity to be vaccinated by the end of 2021.

- The vaccine safety database is huge: > 53 million doses administered in the US alone.
- In Australia, the vaccine has been subject to the complete approval process by the TGA.
- The overall reporting rate is around 3 to 4 Yellow Cards per 1,000 doses administered.

Next Steps

- Maintain situational awareness nationally of COVID-19 transmission
- Monitor and manage ongoing public health measures
- Monitor and review the hotel quarantine management system and explore opportunities to improve current practices and procedures
- Monitor and review COVID-19 testing
- Continue to employ Infection Prevention & Control strategies to mitigate the COVID-19 risk to the community of Western Australia
- Maintain and exercise Outbreak Management Plans
- Manage any outbreak responses, including public health and border measures
- Deliver the COVID-19 Vaccination program to Western Australia
