

Notification of COVID-19 #1

KEY POINTS

- Clinicians SHOULD NO LONGER CALL CDCD or Public Health Units (PHUs) when they order a test for COVID-19
- COVID-19 is an urgently notifiable condition under the *Public Health Act 2016 (WA)*
- Clinicians who order tests for COVID-19 are required to notify either using the online form or the printed notification form, which can be faxed to public health
- Clinicians who order a test for COVID-19 need to make arrangements for the patient to receive the result
- Clinicians should seek Public Health Physician advice if after consulting the <u>Guidelines</u> they have further questions about COVID-19 advice

This alert has been issued to clarify the notification requirements for COVID-19.

On 4 February 2020, a *Public Health (Notifiable Infectious Diseases) Order* was published in which human coronavirus with pandemic potential (COVID-19) was declared to be a notifiable infectious disease and an urgently notifiable infectious disease.

WHAT CLINICIANS NEED TO DO:

NOTIFY the WA Department of Health by completing the notification form:

- ONLINE or
- printing out the <u>notification form</u> and faxing it to the WA Department of Health

Clinicians DO NOT NEED TO CALL public health when they order a test or to report a suspect or confirmed case of COVID-19.

Clinicians should fill out the pathology test form in detail, including the reason for ordering the test and whether the patient is a known contact of a case of COVID-19. Further information about the clinical picture may also assist with prioritisation of tests.

IF a clinician thinks a test should be run urgently – please call the PHU and discuss with a Public Health Physician.

Clinicians (GPs or hospital clinicians) who order tests for COVID-19 need to make arrangements for the patient to receive the result.
